**Columbus, Ohio** – The Franklin County Office on Aging (FCOA), in partnership with the Franklin County Dog Shelter & Adoption Center, is excited to announce its inaugural "Block Pawty" as part of their collaborative initiative, Mission Pawsible. This community event will take place on Friday, Oct. 18 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Franklin County Dog Shelter & Adoption Center.

"Mission Pawsible is an initiative between the Franklin County Office on Aging and the Franklin County Dog Shelter to combat social isolation among seniors in our community," said FCOA Director Chanda Wingo. "Combating social isolation among seniors by connecting them with shelter dogs is a powerful way to improve the mental, emotional, and physical well-being of older adults."

The Mission Pawsible Block Pawty will bring together dog lovers, families, and local organizations for a day of entertainment, education and pet adoption. The event will highlight the campaign's mission to raise awareness about senior isolation while celebrating the joy that rescue pets bring to our lives.

The Block Pawty celebrates this mission, offering the community an opportunity to support a cause that benefits both pets and people.
